11:00 am Katie Michaels, Vermont Housing & Conservation Board

Katie will give an overview of the grant programs and technical service available to farmers

VHCB has been around for 30 years working on land conservation and housing

Katie works for Farm & Forest Viability Program.

- Business Planning is a core service available to farms.
 - Work with 100 farms and 10 forestry businesses per year and they fund partner organizations
 - o 2-year process, \$75 fee for farm, results in written business plan
 - Also do succession planning, trying to meet farmer needs, can bring in other specialists, enterprise analysis
- Grant Program (Katie runs that program)
 - Thank you for your support by getting the word out, two specific applicants referred to CVFC as how they found out about it
 - o \$5,000 \$40,000 grants, 1:1 in-kind match

- o Must be commercial \$15,000 gross income
- o Dairy Improvement Grants
 - Commonwealth Dairy funds it, so only St. Albans and DFA members are eligible
 - Any capital investment is eligible
- Water Quality Improvement Grant
 - State of Vermont funds, open to any Vermont farmer
 - Help farms comply with RAPs
 - Can match EQIP, BMP, FAP or can be stand alone
 - Lots of manure management, equipment

One deadline for both grants: November 7th, February 6th

- Can help reassign to the right pool
- This year's funding is secure, not sure after that
- \$640,000 funded out of \$1,000,000 submitted for WQ
- ~\$300,000 for DIG
- If it is close between projects, priorities go to watershed, previous funding

o Questions:

- Do producers usually fill them out on their own or do they get help?
 - Application is written to be able to have producer do it on their own. Roughly 1/3 probably are getting help.
 - Letters of support are helpful (NRCS, UVM, CDs)
 - DIG requires business plan, they do look at how that projects fits in with overall business. Business planners can help, but call soon.
- Is this the last time the DIG will be offered?
 - Yes, funding is going away after the February round
- o Are there gaps in business planning services?
 - Seems like a lot of the business planners might be beyond capacity.
 Farms sometimes feel a little forgotten about, not getting a lot of follow-up.
 - Farm requested help with succession planning, but was told the planner was busy 'putting out fires'
 - Where is the funding come from for bus. Planning
 - Half from general allocation, the other half comes from federal grant programs and other fundraising. Ex. Beginning farmer/rancher grant.
 - Can the WQ grants be the 10% match for BMP projects? Yes...but the case would need to be made financially through the application narrative and financial statements. We also want to fund viable farms.
 - You should have gone to NRCS, CEAP, etc first.
 - Can you apply for multiple projects in one application? Yes.
 - Would you potentially be funded for both? Potentially, but it has not happened yet.
